France's "Choose France Tour"

France is actively promoting itself as a study destination through its "Choose France Tour," which is taking place across five cities from October 19-27, 2024. Changes to Canadian Work Permit Rules

Starting November 1, Canada will limit post-graduation work permits to degrees in only five fields of study. This is part of a shift in Canada's immigration policy aimed at ensuring international students are better integrated into sectors with labor shortages. This new policy could significantly affect students seeking to stay and work in Canada post-graduation.



EU Launches Initiative to Attract International Students

The European Union has recently launched a new initiative to attract more international students by streamlining visa procedures and offering scholarships for underrepresented countries

Australia's Tighter Immigration Policies

Australia has recently introduced a series of immigration policy changes targeting international students, marking a significant shift in its approach to student visas and post-graduation work permits. This follows a 20% decline in the number of student visas issued in February 2024, the lowest figure in two decades.

The Australian government has responded by making the English language tests more challenging and requiring international students to pass the newly implemented "Genuine Student Test," which assesses the authenticity of their study intentions. These reforms are part of Australia's efforts to ensure that the students they admit are genuinely focused on education and are prepared to meet stricter academic and linguistic standards



UK's Reliance on International Students

UK universities are increasingly dependent on international students' tuition fees, leading to concerns about the sustainability of this model. A new report highlights the growing financial reliance on overseas students, as well as the impact of visa restrictions on the ability of students and their dependents to stay in the UK
